

We held two outreach programs last month. The first was at Brookdale Nursing Home on April 16th where a large group of residents crowded into their recreation room wanting to learn about astronomy. The presentation was an introductory talk covering our solar system out to the edge of the observable Universe. Their Life Enrichment Coordinator has asked ACA to return for another presentation in June. Long time ACA member Lou Poda is currently living at Brookdale Nursing Home. The second outreach program was on April 27th. Coventry Middle School science teachers requested an ACA
