

August 1, 2019 Star Party





Lew Snodgrass set up the observatory 5-inch refractor at the August 1st star party to show the international students Saturn and Jupiter. Many of these students have never seen a star before because they live in cities like Shanghai, China where light pollution and smog make it impossible to see even the brightest stars. American Scholar Group located in Greenville, PA sponsored the students. American Scholar Group gave the Astronomy Club of Akron a \$75 donation after the star party.

Chinese, Japanese, and Korean high school students traveled to the United States this summer to learn about our culture. One of their adventures was a star party at our observatory on August 1, 2019. Tom Alexander set up his 9.25 inch Schmidt-Cassegrain telescope to show the students Jupiter, Saturn, Ring Nebula, and Great Hercules Cluster. Thirty-three students came out to the star party along with five interpreters and chaperons.
