So backyard astronomy is still alive and well in Ohio! We are teaching science lessons for our grandkids in Columbus and they invited two playmate friends to join them. Our tech savvy daughter put us all in "Google Hangout" and we all "signed in" at 2 pm on Wednesday, April 2nd.

We wore our Astronomy Club badges and t-shirts, and were Ms. Marnie and Mr. Mikey for the 30 minutes as teachers. (The grandkids would have none of that however, and stated quite clearly to those two kids that I was their Maw Maw and Mikey was their Paw Paw.)

Our lesson was taken from our "Daisy Troop" material, including a shadow demonstration with "Gort" our robot, the phases of the moon (without the oreo cookies however), and the simulated moon rocks crashing into the moon, ie, a pan of flour dusted with cocoa. I was excited to see the Pleiades above Venus in their pictures as my binoculars weren't good enough for me to see it in my backyard. We just were so thrilled to see these kids enjoying the night sky!


