Observatory Report

On October 29th, ACA held a solar party featuring instruments viewing the Sun in white light and radio frequencies. Dave Hartsook operated our 5-inch refractor that was fitted with a Baader Herschel wedge and Continuum Filter. Jim Watson



set up his radio telescope to observe the Sun at 11.2GHz and recorded the signal on a strip chart recorder for viewing. Glenn Cameron set up his a



refractor fitted with a Herschel wedge and video camera to display the Sun on a video monitor. The sky conditions were excellent with no cloud and relatively low humidity. That evening we had a star party and viewed Jupiter, Saturn, and many star clusters.

ACA has received requests from Boy Scout Troop 777 and American Heritage Girls Troop OH 1225 to help them achieve their astronomy merit badges. We are currently planning to assist these groups. If


Longtime ACA member Dave Jessie was awarded Honorary Lifetime Membership in November.

Blast From Decembers Past

On December 21st, 1968, at 7:51 AM EST, Apollo 8 launched from Kennedy Space Center Launch Complex 39A in Merritt Island, Florida.

My family lived in Miami, Florida and we made the 230 mile drive north to watch 3 launches in the late '60s and early '70s. We saw 2 launches and missed 1 due to a technical delay.

I don't remember what 2 launches we watched. I can't ask my late father and my mother doesn't remember. I am pretty sure that one of the launches was Apollo 8.

The 3rd launch that skunked us was a night launch. After a little internet research I realize it had to be Apollo 17. We drove back home, disappointed. But it launched later that same night at 12:33 AM on December 7th, 1972. My mom and I went out to the front lawn and saw the flaming path painted by the Saturn V's stage 1 engines. It was incredibly exciting!

As I said earlier, one of the other 2 launches I witnessed might have seen Apollo 8. I'll probably never know for sure. But if it was, I must have been standing next to my grandfather who filmed it with his 8mm movie camera. I archived all the family movies to digital a few years ago and the YouTube link below is an excerpt of 1 movie that records the Apollo 8 launch.
