The Tudor House is located at 655 Latham Lane in New Franklin, Ohio in the Portage Lakes region just south of Akron, Ohio. The easiest access is by entering the Portage Lakes State Park from Manchester Rd. Follow this main park road for 1.2 miles to the beach area parking lot. Now, for another piece of news that we've been waiting on for over two years...the ACA and the State of Ohio Department of Natural Resources have successfully negotiated another ten-year lease agreement for the property in the Portage Lakes State Park upon which our observatory is located. Again, the Club is indebted to Mark Kochheiser for his diligent work with Nancy Strayer from the ODNR. In an email from Nancy to Mark on 10/25/2010, she assures us that the lease agreement has been signed by the appropriate State officials and is being mailed to us for our officer signatures. We'll have one to keep with our other important documents and one to return for their file. Mark will let us

know when it arrives. Finally! This has been a constant aggravation since early September of 2008 and we should all breathe a sigh of relief.

The Night Kite Flight and Astronomical Observing outreach event on Oct 30th was partially successful - high winds made observing difficult because it kept the telescopes in constant motion at anything over 50 power. Open clusters were rather easily seen, but poor seeing and transparency rendered everything else pretty unimpressive. At least the sky cleared when it counted after being totally cloudy all day until after dark. Thanks to members Gary Smith, Rick Burke and Rosaelena Villaseñor for helping out with this effort. Also, thanks to onetime member Terry Taylor who also assisted.

One last item - please remember that we do NOT meet in December due to the holidays.

Observatory Report




After a month of cancelled star parties, we finally got some clear skies for our October 9th event. Fortunately the temperature remained moderate throughout the night making observing comfortable. About sixty participants attended the event including two groups of students and teachers from private and public schools. Our featured celestial object was Comet 103P Hartley; however, reports of comet observations from previous nights were poor. Considering the large number of attendees, we decided to observe more sensational celestial objects instead of having novice observers struggle at the evepiece trying to see a barely distinguishable object. Herschel's Double Cluster made a fine substitute for observation. We set up the club loaner scope in the observatory so observers could experience two different views of the star cluster. The 14" telescope provided a close-up view of component NGC869 while the 8" Newtonian gave a wide field view of both clusters situated in a rich field of stars. Planetary nebulae, globular clusters, and Jupiter were


also on the observing list. Later, when the crowd reduced in size, we tried to view the elusive comet. Dave Jessie had his computer cranked up earlier in the afternoon to generate the exact coordinates of the comet at 30-minute intervals. It was our good luck to have these coordinates to accurately place the comet in the center of the eyepiece field. Knowing the comet must be there, using averted vision, and slowly moving the telescope in declination, we were able to see 103P Hartley. It appeared similar to a small faint planetary nebula with an even fainter wisp of nebulosity surrounding the nucleus. Although not very impressive compared to comet 17P Holmes that visited us in October 2007, the comet did hone members' finding skills and techniques used to observe very faint objects.

Dean Wheaton of Clinton, Ohio donated a Meade DS 10 Newtonian telescope to the club. Dean was an ACA club member in the 1980's. Dean also donated astronomical accessories and literature. Thank Dean!
