Observatory Report

Last year we took the Zimmerman 5" refractor out of storage and set it up during a public star party. Todd Michel showed the public stunning views of Jupiter & Saturn. Operationally however, Todd reported some mechanical issues with the telescope that made the telescope challenging to operate. After the star party, we talked about the issues with members present and decided to upgrade the telescope to overcome these issues. If you ever saw the Zimmerman mount, you would agree it's a mechanical marvel, but there are a few issues with the mount that affect its performance. The first is backlash in the mount that requires the operator to overshoot the target in order to place the object in the field of view after the mount relaxes. An overhaul of the mount could solve this problem; however, other issues with the mount have a less easy solution. During the star party Todd was not able to use any of our other eyepieces because the focuser lacked sufficient back focus. Todd was only able to obtain a sharp focus with the Zimmerman 12mm eyepiece. In addition, while focusing, the pinion rolled out of the rack on both ends of the focal range. Stops appear to be missing. The last issue is balancing the

telescope. There is no way to move the optical tube in either direction to balance the telescope's RA axis. This is because the telescope is bolted to a baseplate and the baseplate fastened to the mount. The drive we plan to use requires good balance; else the clutch will slip resulting in no telescope tracking.

Our upgrade included the following: replacing the mount with one that has a drive, replacing the 1.25 inch focuser with our 2 inch Van Slyke focuser, and adding tube rings to allow movement of the optical tube so the telescope can be balanced. We had a mount with a drive in storage that was donated to us by a non-member. The Van Slyke focuser was left over from the 16" focuser upgrade. It's a low profile focuser with one inch of travel. This is not the best focuser choice as we would want more travel, but free makes it quite attractive. Since we needed to adapt the new focuser to the optical tube, we set the location of the focuser to get the focal plane where we would like it to be in order to maximize the usefulness of the short travel. The last modification was adding tube rings. The closest commercially available tube rings we could find was Orion's with an inside diameter of 140mm. This was a little large for the custom optical tube, so we attached teflon inserts to the inside of each tube ring to make up the

couple of choices on counterweights that we found lying around the observatory. We chose the lighter of the two; however the inside diameter was smaller than the mount counterweight shaft. Jim Watson bored out the counterweight to match the shaft size and fabricated two collars to hold the counterweight in place. We only needed to make some small modifications to attach the mount to the existing pier. Thanks to Jim Watson, Gary Ciesielczyk, and Dave Hartsook for their help on this project. And at our May 5th star party, Amy & Gary Ciesielczyk set up the 5" refractor to check out its performance. They viewed a number of celestial objects including the double star Mizar and Beehive Cluster. Amy & Gary reported the telescope tracked well and the 2" focuser had adequate range for our Meade 5000 series 18mm & 6.7mm eyepieces.
