#### **Book Plug**

#### **By Earl Rodd**

Gary Kader, in his May 2025 lecture on the "The Distance Ladder" mentioned a book, "The Glass Universe" which included the story of one of the female "computers" at the Harvard Observatory whose discovery of the relationship of Cepheid variable period to brightness was instrumental in figuring out stellar distances. I bought the Kindle version and read it all. The book, by Dava Sobel, is well written and a thrilling story of the history of stellar astronomy. In the book, we get to know

many truly amazing people, learn about their methods, their discoveries, and the legacy of their work that lives to this day. The stories of the many ladies at the observatory show us a group of very smart, hard-working, people who loved astronomy. The number of "firsts" among them is endless. Just the stories of the heiresses instrumental to the early funding are worth the effort to read the book. The half million glass photographic plates stored at Harvard are still used (as of the 2016 writing, about a quarter of them had been properly cleaned and digitized) today. No modern instrument can tell an astronomer what a star looked like in 1890.






